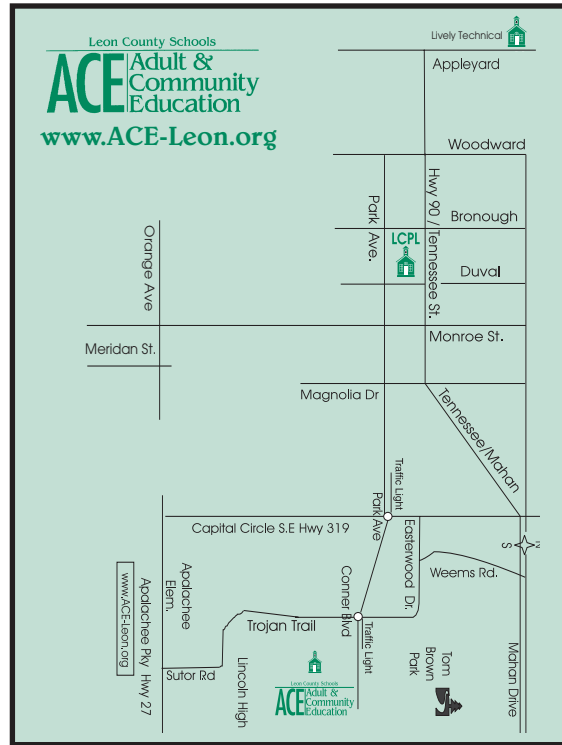

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) helps adults with limited English skills to understand and develop skills needed to live in an American Community.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I enroll in English classes?

Attend a registration session Monday afternoon at ACE or Tuesday evening at the Leon County Public Library.

What should I bring to register?

You only need to provide us with your address and phone number so your teacher can contact you. You will complete the registration form and take an entrance assessment.

What are my responsibilities as a student?

Attend class regularly and on time.

How long can I study English with ACE?

The fall semester will start on August 24, 2009. The spring semester will continue until June 3, 2010. *More than one semester is recommended for most students.*

What skills will I learn?

The classes will help you with listening, speaking, reading, writing, vocabulary, and grammar, as well as living and working in the U.S.

How many students are in a class?

It varies from class to class. The average is 15.

Am I eligible for enrollment?

You must be at least 16 years old and enroll for a minimum of one month.

How will I be evaluated?

We regularly administer English listening and reading assessments to measure your progress.

What can ESOL classes do for you?

- Help you improve your English to obtain a job.
- Assist you in advancing in your career.
- Prepare you for study in a college or university.
- Assist you in preparing for the citizenship test.
- Improve your English skills to attend GED class and earn a high school diploma.

What do you need to do to be successful in the ESOL Class?

- Come to class every day and be on time.
- Use English every day at school, at home and in the community.
- Study hard inside and outside of class.
